SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

We sail with every middle and high school in the SF District system almost always on Thursday...and with two exceptions in December, every Thursday will have a sail until the end of the school year. And those two exceptions are likely to be filled soon. Next sails 12/5.

We have them work the boat, be at the wheel, show them the life teeming in the Bay. They are at the helm of a famous 46-foot open ocean racer...and working the boat. We have now been doing this for well over thirty years...our first students have grown children now...

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

- 1. SF PORT AUTHORITY has a summer program for high school students and is reaching out for a week of classes this coming summer. Shannon is in communication with them. Stay tuned.
- 2.CDC of Marin is checking out community groups in Marin City and other locales in Marin. 3.SILVER SPRINGS HIGH just completed their sail on Bear and wants to keep scheduling these sails.
- 4. PAL (Police Activities League), which is an eighty-year-old organization that provides sports to youth in the City, working with police, is exploring possible sails with Blue Water. Their board will be meeting to decide the scope of the partnership. Stay tuned.
- 5. Such people as Captain Jim and Kimberly are reaching out to even more community groups and that is one reason we have so many of these sails on the schedule. Check out which groups you would like to work with...!



PROBATION DEPARTMENT SAILS:

Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

- 1. First Aid and CPR —Our next class will be on NOVEMBER 23, 2024, BERKELEY YACHT CLUB. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. SIGN UP ON OUR WEBSITE EVENTS PAGE.
- 2. Certification sail on Bear end of January...check events page.
- 3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> has a live overboard practice sail on **NOVEMBER 16** and has <u>night</u> overboard live practice on **DECEMBER 7**. DO NOT SIGN UP FOR NIGHT OVERBOARD WORK UNTIL YOU HAVE DONE A DAY OVERBOARD DRILL.
- 4. <u>ALETA</u> has her certification sail on **JANUARY 11** and will include live overboard drill.
- 5. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.

BOSUN'S REPORT:

GOLDEN BEAR: A scrape on the hull was fixed with epoxy. Parts of the foredeck still need cleaning. Dehumidifier that vacates overboard being installed.
