SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICT SAILS:

We sail with every middle and high school in the SF District system...We are down to our final sails of the school year, the last ones on 5/23 and 5/30. At long last the police are staffing the Wilderness Program again and police are likely to be assigned to the sails again in Fall.

COMMUNITY SAILS:

Community sails are continuing, and we have many new exciting programs:

1. Our program for visually impaired sailors is moving along but quite slowly. It was decided to have a committee formed to get this program up and running. Anyone interested in participating in this should contact Lee at lstimmel@stimmel-law.com. Keep in mind we are working with Captain Andrew to begin the blind racing team, and also having blind sailors as some of our volunteers on the probation sails. Do we also want a special program working

with Light House with blind sailors? That is up to the committee to decide and if you are interested, let's get it going...

2. *Epilepsy Foundation* has changed some of their management so delayed their next sail...but we expect new dates to be scheduled on Benjamin Walters in Fall. Remember, Type 1 life are to be on each participant since they may be unconscious in the water.

3. *Project Rebound*, formerly incarcerated adults and interns learning to work with them have already joined the Sweeney sails, working on becoming certified. Some of the interns are also helping with the social media platforms of Blue Water. A new batch will be joining us in the next few months as the interns graduate.

4. PACT sails. The sails went well and more will be scheduled soon.

5. *Silver Springs* high school students come all the way from Grass Valley and have scheduled a sail for May 21.

6. APACC (Asian Pacific Islanders American students) have personnel changes and will be rescheduling soon.

7. *International Rescue Project.* Their sail went well and the next one is July 15 on Bear. We may need two boats for this one.

8. *Marin City.* Les is reaching out to them to set up more sails.

9. SF Casa is next set for July 20.

10. *Marín City CDC* has met with Jim Stanton and Lee and will be arranging sails in the near future...with numerous community groups.

11. *Dream Team Double Sail* on Aleta and Bear, June 1. Note Aleta crew will have to take Aleta to San Francisco for this sail.

12. Weekend Adventures June 22 and June 29 on Bear.

Training & Certification:

The quickest way to move up the certification ladder...and a lot of fun.

1.<u>First Aid and CPR</u> –Our last class was **May 18 at BERKELEY YACHT CLUB.** We will be setting up another one in a few months. FREE TO VOLUNTEERS, MUCH OF IT ONLINE, AND REQUIRED FOR CERTIFICATION AS CREW AND CAPTAINS. YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON LINE PORTION BEFORE ATTENDING THE CLASS WHICH HAS THE "HANDS ON" PRACTICE. 2. Certification sail on <u>Bear</u> May 25, including live MOB practice. Another certification planned for June 15.

3. <u>Benjamin Walters</u> had a <u>night</u> overboard live practice June 21...only open to those who have completed a day MOB and intend to go on our night sails.

4. <u>ALETA</u> certification sail with MOB practice on June 8.

5. And recall if come on a sail as a guest or crew, make sure the captain checks out your skills and you can move along the certification list.

BOSUN'S REPORT:

<u>GOLDEN BEAR:</u> Sail covers and bags plus some jib hanks need repairs and Colm is handling that. The boom vang needs works on its hydraulics (which Colm repaired years ago) and he will be addressing that soon.

<u>ALETA</u>: Scott has repaired the jib that was torn in the storm and a rigger has repaired and rebalanced the rear stay. Scott has also repaired some cracks in the floor of the cockpit. The jib is ancient so we are looking for a new/used jib to replace it down the road and Scott has the figures for an appropriate new jib.

BENJAMIN WALTERS: Whisker pole is now ready to mount, and this will be one of the skills we teach to our students. It now has a new head and is installing a new holding tank system. Note Benjamin is on K dock while the marina replaces wiring in O dock.

Devine Wind: Ready to race and Captain Andrew is getting the team together...
